The course will include an overview of how WordQ SpeakQ has been used to support learners with SEND to write to their full potential as well as training on many of the features to support you introduce this tool to learners. We recommend that attendees come along to WordQ SpeakQ: More Advanced Features and Exams (dates in 2018) after beginning to use it in schools to get one to one support and to learn about more advanced features and using this sort of software in exams.
