

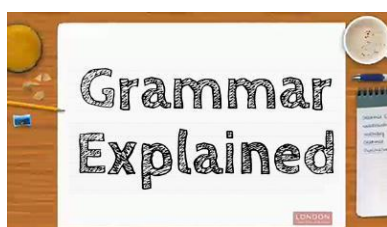


# FIVE WAYS TO SUPPORT RELUCTANT WRITERS

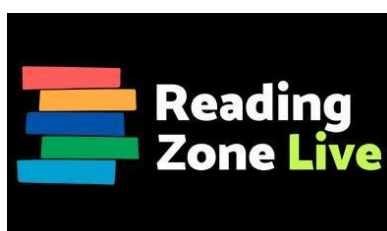
